

Every year about this time we find ourselves saying something like "Is it Lent already? Didn't we just get through Christmas?" For those of us who are too young to have been around the last time Easter fell on April 1<sup>st</sup> I suppose it might seem somewhat odd this year. The celebration of Christ's resurrection doesn't seem to really fit with playing jokes and gags on friends and family members. But then again this seemingly rare occurrence may serve as a vivid reminder to us that our Savior Jesus comes to us where we are, no matter wherever we may be. Our Lord Jesus is present among us each and every day of our lives no matter what – always there to surround us with love and grace and peace especially when we need it the most.

Throughout the 40 days of Lent we will have the opportunity to once again reflect upon our lives of faith as we prepare for Holy Week, the Three Days, and finally Easter. A glorious day is coming and now is the time to prepare our hearts and our souls for the celebration that awaits us.

With everyone helping, we will have everything ready to be packed and delivered to the In-gathering on April 5.

The Piecemakers recently received a request from the 2018 NT-NL Synod Assembly Planning Team to send a swatch of our quilting fabric to be used in the construction of two quilts which will be displayed at the upcoming assembly on April 27-28. These two quilts will be constructed from the swatches sent by every NT-NL congregation and worshipping community. More importantly the quilts will serve as a symbol and reminder that "God continues to transform us into a new creation, and that He is transforming our families, our communities, and our Synod." One of the two quilts will be permanently displayed at the synod offices, and the other will be auctioned at the assembly. The money from the auction will be given to the ministries in our synod.

We meet in the quilting room on the first and third Mondays of the month from 10:00-1:00, and Wednesday evenings following Lenten services until 8:30. #### Public Witness Workshop: "The Role of the Church in Undoing Racism"

March 9-10 of the coming year, the NT-NL Public Witness for Peace and Justice team will offer a workshop that addresses racism from a faith-based perspective:

Theology: What we believe; what God calls us to be and do

History: How the past influences us today

Accountability: How the Lutheran Church in faithfulness to God's call, must deal with the

reality of racism

This workshop is designed to provide participants of our synod with an analysis that specifically focuses on systemic rather than individual factors of racism. Through facilitated dialogue, the workshop will increase understanding of what racism is, how it is manifested in all systems and institutions, and the role of Church in dismantling racism in the community of faith and in society at large.

The workshop facilitators will be Mrs. Joyce James and the Reverend Joseph Barndt. *Mrs. James* is a racial equity consultant who provides training and technical assistance to organizations across the country as they address institutional and structural racism. She is the former Associate Deputy Executive Commissioner for the Center for the Elimination of Disproportionality and Disparities and the Texas State Office of Minority Health. Mrs. James was a keynote speaker at the 2014 Synod Assembly. *The Reverend Joseph Barndt* is an ELCA pastor; for over forty years he has been an anti-racism trainer. Pastor Barndt is the author of a number of books including *The Role of the Church in Undoing Racism, Dismantling Racism*, and *Becoming an Anti-Racist Church*. He is also a community organizer and trainer with the People's Institute for Survival and Beyond.

The workshop will be held Friday, March 9, 4:30 – 8:00 p.m. and Saturday, March 10, 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., at Shepherd of Life Lutheran Church, Arlington; registration fee is \$50.00.
